We are delighted to welcome you to the Utah Beach D-Day Museum, which is affiliated with the Sainte-Mère-du-Mont town hall. We are committed to environmental protection and sustainable development. Within our facility and in the context of the tours we offer, we strive to act responsibly through various initiatives:

Monitor and reduce all consumption

- Gradual replacement of light bulbs with LEDs
- Use of refillable, concentrated cleaning products to minimize waste
- Use of washable microfiber cloths
- Installation of automatic doors to reduce heat loss between the hangar and the museum galleries
- Museum primarily fitted with double glazing
- Heating and air conditioning programmed to align with museum opening hours, with temperatures capped at 21°C.

Sorting and recovering waste

- Installation of sorting bins
- Signage to facilitate understanding

Raising staff awareness of the environmental approach

- Limiting printing and prioritizing email communication
- Discontinuing newsletters to reduce email volume
- Informing and encouraging staff regarding best practices and eco-friendly habits via signage and the welcome handbook
- Use of non-polluting cleaning products

Preserve the site

- Restoration of the site after any activity
- Waste collection carried out by our team
- Integration of the museum into the ecosystem with a partially green roof
- No use of chemical products for outdoor areas
- Installation of fences to protect the dune and channel visitors

Shop responsibly

- Printed on PEFC-certified paper (certifying respect for the environmental, economic, and social functions of forests) using vegetable-based inks.
- Buy-back of second-hand boutique furniture
- Promotion of French producers and short supply chains
